As 'revenge' trial begins, one pleads guilty

WEST CHESTER » The gunman in what authorities contend was a revenge shooting in Coatesville against a witness pleaded guilty Monday just as his trial was set to begin, while his alleged accom-plice elected to go forward and contest the charges against him. Ahmad Jamal Thomas admit-

Ahmad Jamal Thomas admit-ted shooting a Coatesville man in 2020 who had cooperated with city police years before in an in-vestigation of Thomas' cousin, Ar-mon Jones, who is Thomas' co-de-fendant in the current case. The man lived, but is not cooperating with the prosecution of Jones, a prosecutor said.
